ILLÉS SARKANTYU

Artist photographer and filmmaker born in Budapest in 1977. Lives and works between Paris and Bordeaux.

Illés Sarkantyu doesn't like art for art's sake but for awakening. Yes, to use a famous expression, "art is what makes life more interesting than art", because in him develops the concern for the world.

After graduating from the Moholy-Nagy University of Applied Art in Budapest in 2000, Illés Sarkantyu was appointed head of the photographic studio and laboratory.

In 2002, he moves to Paris. Thanks to art collectors Judit Nemes and András Szöllősi-Nagy, he creates portraits of the circle of artists and intellectuals of Hungarian origin that he then exhibits in 2006, under the title Franco-Hungarian, at the French Institute of Budapest.

In 2011, at the same venue, Sarkantyu presents Mihály, an audiovisual device commemorating the figure of the father. His interest in questions of absence and presence, memory and heritage, has nourished his work ever since.

From February 2013 to April 2014, he is invited in residence at the Domaine de Kerguéhennec. From this work, Ombrées is born, a project that evokes the spirit of the place. This new work, mixing photography and film, will be exhibited in the same art centre in 2014.

In 2015, he produced a photographic work by recomposing Marc Chagall's famous stained glass window "La Paix". The photographs are accompanied by the musical creations of the composer Jean-Baptiste Doulcet, with whom he is working in duo for the exhibition at the Musée du Pays de Sarrebourg.

Since 2007, he has been working on the background of the photographer Lucien Hervé. The handling of these archives has inspired him to create a series of photographs which are the subject of several exhibitions. A complex assemblage of these files, entitled "Contacts", took place in particular in the exhibition Dans l'atelier at the Petit Palais in Paris in 2016.

Illés Sarkantyu's work is represented by the Galerie de La Forest Divonne, Paris - Brussels. Solo exhibitions: Less is more (2014), Paraphrases (2016) and Abstraction du concret (2018).
