La Forest Divonne Gallery is pleased to present Valérie Novello's second solo exhibition in its Paris space.

On view from January 22 to February 28, the exhibition, entitled "Le bel été" ("The Beautiful Summer"), brings together the artist's most recent works, created during her summer spent in Puglia, Italy, where she immersed herself in a luminous and meditative natural landscape of sea, mountains, and olive groves.

Upon seeing these deeply accomplished works and the joy that emanated from them, the decision to unveil them in an exhibition became immediately evident.



A dialogue between nature and memory

The garden and the act of wandering through nature are essential sources of inspiration for Valérie

Novello. They echo her inner journey and provide the introspection necessary to reveal, on paper, what lies hidden like a buried secret. Each work is born from an intimate dialogue between body, material, and memory.

As Alexandra Swenden writes:

"In Valérie Novello's work, each creation is first experienced through the body. (...) Invisible yet everpresent, the substance of our inner depths permeates her pieces."

Originally from Piedmont, the artist draws from this region both her roots and her imagination. Her compositions oscillate between the vegetal microcosm and the distant horizon.

"Walking through a landscape allows me to reconnect with a very ancient and intimate memory. I also need to work on large formats so that my body can merge into my drawing," she confides.

The exhibited series

The exhibition brings together several groups of works in small, medium, and large formats:

The **pastels frottés**, created on Japanese and Nepalese papers, are placed by Valérie Novello over reliefs she has previously sculpted to give them form. Then comes the application of pastel color, where the line reveals a true cartography of memory.

The delicate and colorful **collaged papers** evoke a reimagining of the world through fragments.

The series "Au travers" explores transparency and the layering of drawing, like a poetic X-ray.

Finally, the **paper and plaster sculptures** extend this dialogue between lightness and material.

An archaeology of sensitivity

Like an archaeologist of memory, Valérie Novello captures traces of an inner world and fixes them on paper, suspended between reverie and revelation.

BIOGRAPHY

Valérie Novello graduated from the École Nationale Supérieure des Beaux-Arts de Paris in the "Sculpture - Mixed Media" department. Born in 1971, she lives and works in Gentilly and has been exhibiting regularly since 1994.

The dissemination of her work accelerated from 2019 onwards, with exhibitions in France, Belgium, Italy, and Taiwan. La Forest Divonne Gallery has represented her work in Paris and Brussels since 2021. In 2022, she participated in the groundbreaking project "L'Œuvre au corps", collaborating with Michelin-starred chef Adeline Grattard.

Following presentations at Art On Paper in Belgium in 2022 and 2023, as well as a solo show at Drawing Now in Paris in 2023, the gallery held her first solo exhibition in its Brussels space in 2023, followed by one in Paris the following year.

In 2024, Valérie Novello was invited by Alexandre Swenden to exhibit at his multidisciplinary venue Les Passagées in Brussels.
